OPENING FALL CREDIT STUDENT ENROLLMENT

The purpose of this Research Brief is to describe the student population (headcount) enrolled in degree credit programs and attending classes at St. Petersburg Junior College at the end of the first week of classes (FTE date) during the Fall Session 1993. The table below describes the Fall 1993 credit student profile by home campus and compares this year's collegewide profile with the same timeframe in Fall 1992. Recall that students are asked to identify one of three locations as a home campus when they apply for admission--St. Petersburg/Gibbs Campus, Clearwater Campus, or Tarpon Springs Center.

Significant details:

1. Program

Overall credit headcount enrollment decreased slightly over the previous fall. There was an increase in the percentage of students enrolled in the college transfer A.A. degree program from Fall 1992 (69.3%) to Fall 1993 (71.6%) and for students enrolled in A.S. degree/Vocational Certificate programs (from 16% in Fall 1992 to 17% in Fall 1993). The percentage of students enrolled in credit courses, but not enrolled in degree programs, decreased from 14.7% in Fall 1992 to 11.4% in Fall 1993.

2. Type of Attendance

The distribution of students based on matriculated credit hours, with full-time enrollment equal to 12 or more hours, showed that the percentage of students enrolled full-time decreased from 29.5% (Fall 1992) to 26.9% (Fall 1993).

3. Gender

Collegewide there are more females (60.6%) than males (39.4%) in Fall 1993. This same pattern is followed on each of the campuses and is consistent with the Fall 1992 profile.

4. Age

One-half of our students collegewide (51.7%) continue to be between 15 and 24 years of age which is a slight decrease from the previous Fall semester (52.9%). While the percentage of enrolled students 25 to 39 years increased slightly (from 35% in Fall 1992 to 36.6% in Fall 1993) there was a slight decrease in the percentage of students over 40 years of age (from 12.1% in Fall 1992 to 11.7% in Fall 1993).

5. Ethnicity

On a collegewide basis, 86.8% of SPJC students are white; 6.3% are black; 3.4% are Hispanic; 2.6% are Asian; and 0.9% are American Indian. As has been the trend over the past few years, the number of ethnic minorities, especially African-Americans has continued to increase.

In summary, there have been some changes in the enrollment pattern (fewer non-degree seeking and more minority and older students), trends which we have been seeing increase over the past several years.

Knowledge of the number and profile of the student population served is important to college faculty and administration. Of equal importance, especially for college program planning, is the distribution of students across the various types of courses taught at SPIC. Table 2 shows the distribution of Fall 1993 FTE date enrollment by credit/audit students collegewide and by campus. Note that credit FTE's generated at the Health Education Center, Allstate, Carillon and other off-campus sites are listed as other sites. Collegewide 62.9% of generated FTE's are in Advanced and Professional courses, 27.4% are in Postsecondary Vocational courses, and 9.7% are in College Preparatory courses. The Fall 1992 enrollments and percentages are shown for comparison. Compared to the previous year at the end of the drop/add period, there is a slight increase in vocational degree course and college preparatory course enrollment.
