## 1. MADEIRA BEACH (4.7 MILES)

Head to "Mad Beach" where John's Pass Village and Boardwalk is buzzing with more than 100 shops and restaurants in an Old Florida-style waterfront atmosphere. Take the Tom Stuart Causeway, an impressive bridge with great views, to this bustling beach. Explore the surf shops and art galleries, then enjoy fresh seafood along the boardwalk at the Friendly Fisherman or Sculley's.

## 2. INDIAN ROCKS BEACH (6.1 MILES)

In Indian Rocks Beach, beat the heat and find tons of thrills at the new Splash Harbour Water Park featuring two 42-foot tall waterslides, a lazy river and zero-entry pool. Also, be sure to stop by the Indian Rocks Historical Museum—a fascinating trip back in time in this beachfront town and, best of all, it's totally free.

## 3. CLEARWATER BEACH (10.6 MILES)

Fun-loving Clearwater Beach was voted the No. 1 beach in America in 2016 and No. 20 in the world in 2016 by TripAdvisor. Wide sugar-sand beaches and emerald-clear surf dotted with dolphins make this an active beach scene. Soak in the sun, then dust off the sand and enjoy all this city-beach has to offer from downtown Beach Walk's shops, to waterfront restaurants like Frenchy's, and rooftop bars, including Jimmy's Crow's Nest.

## 4. ST. PETE BEACH (13.3 MILES)

With miles of beaches, surf shops and boutiques, along with a vast array of lodging, dining and water sports for all ages, it's easy to see why St. Pete Beach was voted TripAdvisor's No. 4 Beach in the U.S. in 2016. From The Don CeSar to the family-friendly TradeWinds Island Resorts and dozens of hotels and small inns, there's a place for all tastes and budgets. Try Jimmy B's, the Undertow and Harry's for a cocktail, or try one of the area's rooftop lounges for 360-degree views.

## 5. DOWNTOWN ST. PETERSBURG (17.6 MILES)

### A. BEACH DRIVE (OCEAN FRONT, BARS & RESTAURANTS)

### B. SUNDIAL (SHOPPING, DINING, AND MOVIE THEATER)

## C. CENTRAL AVENUE (ART HISTORY, LOCAL BARS AND RESTAURANTS)

St Petersburg's Central Arts District, The Edge, Grand Central, and our new Warehouse Arts District; all showcasing unique and wonderful shopping, delicious dining, and some of the finest art, music and theatre in the country.

## D. DALI MUSEUM

The Salvadore Dali Museum in downtown St. Pete offers an unparalleled collection of the famous Spanish artist's work in America. The museum hosts special exhibits throughout the year, including children's activities, film, music, lectures and more. Daily guided tours and audio guides are free with admission. Browse the Museum, enjoy the Spanish-themed Cafe and wander the waterside Avant Garden.

## E. THE FLORIDA HOLOCAUST MUSEUM

The Museum features a permanent exhibition of one-of-a-kind artifacts from the Holocaust, and traveling exhibitions of art and history. One of three Holocaust Museums accredited by the American Alliance of Museums, the Museum uses the lessons of the past to help create a better future for all.

## F. SUNKEN GARDENS

Sunken Gardens is a botanical paradise in the midst of a bustling city. As St. Petersburg's oldest living museum, this 100-year-old garden is home to some of the oldest tropical plants in the region. Unwind as you stroll through meandering paths, lush with exotic plants from around the world. Explore cascading waterfalls, beautiful demonstration gardens, more than 50,000 tropical plants and flowers and a walk-through butterfly encounter. It's a perfect way for families, couples and friends to spend some time in paradise.
