ST. PETERSBURG COLLEGE

Overview

Founded in 1927, SPC is Florida's first two-year college and the first to offer bachelor's degrees. SPC offers more than 100 degree and certificate programs, including many high-demand, high-skill industry-recognized workforce certifications. The college's career-focused curriculum is created with input from industry experts to give students the skills they need to meet the needs of today's employers. SPC's Guided Pathways Program gives students a clear roadmap to success to ensure they are taking the right courses - in the right sequence - to meet their goals. The college's mission is to "promote student success and enrich our communities through education, career development and self-discovery." At the core of that mission is SPC's College Experience, a data-driven, five-pronged approach to increase student success through tutoring and out-of-classroom support; integrated career and academic advising; an early alert system to provide struggling students with additional resources; a robust learning plan; and a "Smart Start" orientation to connect students with college resources and provide them with the knowledge they need to be successful in college.

Degrees and Programs

St. Petersburg College offers the following academic programs:

- About two dozen **bachelor's degrees** that meet local workforce demands in high-needs areas.
- An **Associate in Arts** degree that emphasizes a liberal arts education and prepares students for a bachelor's degree at SPC or to transfer to a four-year college or university.
- Career and technical education programs (**Associate in Science and Certificates**) that lead to well-paying jobs in Pinellas County or furthering your career.

SPC is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges which means credits transfer to reputable institutions.

Community Partnerships

- Our **partnerships with Pinellas County Schools** helps high school students prepare for college and earn high school and college credit for college-level work.
- Our alliance with more than a dozen colleges and universities through the **University Partnership Center** offers bachelor's and graduate degrees to local residents.
- **Joint-use libraries** on the St. Petersburg/Gibbs and Seminole campuses highlight unique partnerships between SPC and the cities of St. Petersburg and Seminole.

2015-16 — A year of achievement for St. Petersburg College

- **St. Petersburg College athletics had a banner year** as SPC Alumni Bobby Wilson signed with the Tampa Bay Rays as a backup catcher. He is the 11th SPC baseball player to make it to the major leagues. In other sports, SPC's tennis and basketball teams qualified for the state tournaments. The tennis doubles team won the state championship and qualified for nationals.
- St. Petersburg College marked the milestone of **graduating its 150,000th student**.
- St. Petersburg College celebrated the **50th anniversary of the Clearwater Campus** in November. The campus is home to the Crossroads Gallery, the Titan Baseball team and the Collaborative Center for Emerging Technologies, the Tampa Bay area's first open manufacturing factory work environment to train tomorrow's engineering technology and manufacturing employees.
- St. Petersburg College was once again among the top 20 four-year colleges in the United States for serving veterans, ranked at 19 according to the **Military Times' Best for Vets**.
- St. Petersburg College has again been named a **2016 Military Friendly School** by Victory Media, Inc. The Military Friendly® Schools designation is awarded to the top colleges, universities, community colleges and trade schools in the country that are doing the most to embrace military student
- SPC has been selected as one of only 30 community colleges in the nation to participate in a three-year intensive **Pathways Project**, led by the American Association of Community Colleges (AACC).
- In October, SPC sponsored the second annual **Moving the Needle Conference** where more than 250 educators from more than 40 colleges and universities across the country met to share best practices and learn new ways to improve the use of data leading to student success.
- In September, St. Petersburg College was chosen as the **2015 EPA Brownfield Phoenix Award winner** for the development of the new Douglas L. Jamerson, Jr. Midtown Center. This prestigious award honors the innovative leadership of men and women working to solve the critical environmental problems of transforming abandoned property into productive sites for new economic and community opportunities and assets.
- **Achieving the Dream** honored St. Petersburg College with the Leader College distinction – a national designation awarded to community colleges that commit to improving student success and closing achievement gaps.
- **SPC Model United Nations** teams from St. Petersburg College **received honors at the Florida Model United Nations Conference** in Gainesville and the National Model United Nations Conference in the Czech Republic.
 - In Gainesville, the France group received the Outstanding Delegation Award, and the Albania and Cuba groups received an Honorable Mention Delegation Award. Rebekka Sauer received Best Delegated Award for General Assembly.
 - In a UN simulation with more than 300 American and international students in the Czech Republic, the SPC team received the Honorable Mention Delegation award. Two SPC students, Lewis Morgan and Armando Pellot, also were awarded the Outstanding Position Paper Award in the General Assembly Plenary committee. The team represented China.
- **SPC students named 2015 Coca-Cola Leaders of Promise Scholars**. Two St. Petersburg College students

from the Tarpon Springs Campus were selected as 2015 Coca-Cola Leaders of Promise Scholars. Courtney Ducharme and Gabriele Prause were chosen for outstanding academic achievement and leadership potential from more than 1,100 Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society applicants worldwide.

- **SPC's Exploratory Lab Boot Camp was named Best Student Program of the Year** by the Tampa Bay Technology Forum (TBTF) at its 2015 Industry Achievement Awards Gala at the A La Carte Pavilion in Tampa. The Program is successful because of the collaboration between area companies and colleges. Tech Data, Valpak; and Agile Thought hosted the program, with Tech Data creating the curriculum. St. Petersburg College lead the operation of the program with assistance by TBTF.
- St. Petersburg College **alumni rank fifth in the nation and first in the state of Florida**, among two-year colleges, for **possessing the most valuable job skills that garner high wages**, according to a recent report released by the Metropolitan Policy Program at the Brookings Institution, an independent, nonprofit think tank headquartered in Washington, D.C.
 - For SPC graduates, the value of alumni skills came in at \$65,499 compared to a national average of \$61,048 (for graduates of two-year colleges), while the SPC graduate median mid-career salary was \$54,000 compared to the national average of \$52,945 (for graduates of two-year colleges).
- SPC's College of Education has been awarded a **three-year, \$5 million grant from the Florida Department of Education** to restructure our elementary education programs. Dubbed the College of Education Center of Excellence in Elementary Teacher Preparation, the program is a joint partnership between St. Petersburg College and Pinellas County Schools, in collaboration with The New Teacher Project and Learning Sciences International. SPC is the only state college in Florida to receive the grant and was one of only four recipients statewide.
- St. Petersburg College joined two other state colleges in receiving a **\$5 million grant from the U.S. Department of Labor** that will increase apprenticeships and help close the workforce skills gaps in the information technology, manufacturing, healthcare, and construction and trades industries in Florida.
- At the 2016 Degrees to Jobs Summit, Governor Rick Scott awarded St. Petersburg College the **Governor's Higher Education Leadership Award** at the Degrees to Jobs Summit. The college was recognized for their investment in Florida's future by **having graduates with the highest entry-level wage** of Florida's state colleges.
- The St. Petersburg College student newspaper *The Sandbox News* **rocked the student awards in the Florida Society of News Editors** journalism contest by winning eleven out of 24 student awards – all while vying against large universities like USF, UF and FSU.
- **Phi Theta Kappa's Eta Nu** chapter, located at the Gibbs campus, recently took home the **Distinguished Honors in Action award** for their research-based Honors in Action Project.
- **Six St. Petersburg College faculty members** were chosen to receive the **2015 John & Suanne Roueche Excellence Awards from the League for Innovation** in the Community College. The 2015 St. Petersburg College award winners are:
- **OnlineColleges.com ranked St. Petersburg College number one** out of 112 Florida peer institutions for Best Online College. The college received a 99.61 overall rating.
- In response to local industry needs, St. Petersburg College rolled out two newly accredited associate in science degrees in 2016: **Biotechnology Laboratory Technology and Biomedical Engineering Technology**.

- St Petersburg College, University of South Florida Tampa (USFT) and University of South Florida St. Petersburg (USFSP) have collaborated to launch the **FUSE program**. This collaboration promotes a seamless transition for students wishing to complete a bachelor’s degree at USFSP after completing their associate degree with SPC. SPC enrolled its first pilot class in Fall 2016.
- **College leaders selected for honor.** Dr. Tonjua Williams, Sr. Vice President of Student Services, and Dr. Jesse Coraggio, Vice President of Institutional Effectiveness and Academic Services, have each been awarded the prestigious Aspen Presidential Fellowship for Community College Excellence. They were two of only 40 nationwide selected for the inaugural class of the Fellowship.
- Brittany Baldwin, Career and Academic Advisor at the Downtown Campus, is this year’s recipient of the **2016 Silverberg Endowment Grant**. Baldwin will receive \$5,000 to implement a student **mentorship program** at the five local elementary schools ranked among the lowest performing in the state.
- **SPC’s Southeastern Public Safety Institute** was notified in Fall 2016 that it had received a **perfect audit** for the 2014-15 year. St. Petersburg College was named one of six training centers out of 40 that received a perfect audit. The audit reviews the trust fund monies allocated to the training center, as well as the compliance of all class and recruit files.
- The St. Petersburg Area Chamber of Commerce has nominated the Palladium at St. Petersburg College as a “Good ‘Burger,” for the Best Cool Company.
- The Palladium at St. Petersburg College earned the highest point total during Monday’s arts grant review by the City of St. Petersburg’s Arts Advisory Committee. Scoring a 95.86 out of a possible 100, the Palladium was praised by panel members for its “diverse programming” and “outreach to all parts of the community.”
- **Continued recognition of the value of the College Experience and the Wednesday Webinar communication and reporting process;**
 - St. Petersburg College’s weekly webinar on the College Experience continues to attract national attention, evidenced by the number of requests we have fielded for access to a Wednesday session; these requests have come from Alamo College District (San Antonio), Austin Community College, Broward College, Clark State Community College, Cuyahoga Community College, Florida State College at Jacksonville, Grossmont Community College District (CA), Johnson County Community College, San Jacinto College District (TX), University of Florida, CCCSE (Austin), Gates Foundation, Jobs for the Future (national foundation), Achieving the Dream and a class of higher education graduate students from National American University
 - Conference presentations: 2016 Achieving the Dream Conference, 2016 AACC Conference
 - Awards and recognition: University Business Magazine *2015 Models of Excellence* Award
- **St. Petersburg Collegiate High School Earns Multiple Awards**
 - SPC’s Collegiate High School ranked **#1 public high school in Tampa Bay**. Niche’s Best High Schools ranks more than 14,000 schools nationwide based on academics, health and safety, diversity, survey responses, teachers grade and resources and facilities.
 - Newsweek has named St. Petersburg Collegiate High School (SPCHS) as **one of “America’s Top High Schools 2015,”** ranking them **#1 in Florida and #48 in the nation**. SPCHS earned the top ranking in Florida and earned a star, which indicates that the school met Newsweek’s Equity measure by helping low-income students score at or above average on state assessments. SPCHS has earned an A from the state of Florida every year since it opened in 2004.

- St. Petersburg College finished among the **top three colleges in the nation in 2015 for student voter registrations** among 140 colleges and universities participating in a nationwide democracy project known as **TurboVote**.
- Attesting to the college's national reputation for using 'real-time' data and information to improve student outcomes, Bill Law, SPC President, and Jesse Coraggio, Vice President for Institutional Effectiveness and Academic Services, shared some of SPC's best practices at the inaugural **Data and Analytics Summit** Sept. 9-10.
- The **Respiratory Care program** won **Distinguished Credentialing Success Award** for the second year in a row from the Commission on Accreditation for Respiratory Care (CoARC).
- SPC's **Dental Hygiene program** was the only dental hygiene program that was accepted and participated in "**Lessons in a Lunchbox**" this past spring for the Children's Oral Health Institute. All the other invited participants are dental schools, many top notch "big" name universities. A copy of the publication can be found on the **Children's Oral Health Institute** website.
- The latest yearly rankings from the **U.S. Department of Education and the Florida Community College System** show what can happen when excellence is the standard. Matched with two-year programs at both two- and four-year institutions, SPC ranked:
 - No. 7 in the nation in associate degrees awarded in liberal arts & sciences, general studies and humanities;
 - No. 11 in the nation for the number of associate degrees awarded in nursing;
 - No. 12 in the number of associate degrees in all disciplines;
 - SPC received the 2015 EPA Brownfield Phoenix Award for the development of the new Douglas L. Jamerson, Jr. Midtown Center, which opened in 2015. This prestigious award honors the innovative leadership of men and women working to solve the critical environmental problems of transforming abandoned property into productive sites for new economic and community opportunities and assets;
 - For the second time in 10 years, SPC's M.M. Bennett Library system recently won the national Community College Program Achievement Award from the Association of College and Research Libraries;
 - No. 18 in the number of associate degrees awarded in health professions and related programs;
 - No. 46 in the number of associate degrees awarded in computer and information sciences;
 - SPC alumni rank fifth in the nation among two-year colleges in skills that garner high wages;
 - SPC ranks in Top 100 nationally for enrollment of Hispanic student undergrads.
